

## **BUTTERMILK FALLS (Stanley area)**

**Distance:** about 3 km return

**Difficulty:** easy

### **CAUTION:**

**The last 600 meters is poorly marked, with multiple intersecting paths, so don't forget your compass. There are sometimes wet areas on the trail, so be prepared to bushwhack a bit if necessary.**



### **Getting There:**

From Fredericton travel Rt. 8 towards Boisetown for 36 kilometers, exit onto the Nashwaak Bridge Road and drive towards Stanley.

Drive 7.6 km on route 107 to the McLaggan Bridge.

Cross the bridge and drive 1.2 km until you see the Cross Creek Station Road on the right.

Park on the side of the Cross Creek Station Road.

### **The Trail:**

Safely cross route 107 and walk back towards McLaggan Bridge for 60 meters to an old rail bed on the right.

Follow the rail bed for 800 meters. (46° 16.521'N 66° 41.501'W)

Turn left and walk 30 meters, then turn right.

Walk about 200 meters and turn left.

Walk about 115 meters to a large White Pine Tree. (46° 16.374'N 66° 41.608'W)

From here trend to the right across an open area, then follow the scantily marked trail for about 300 meters SOUTH to the Nashwaak River. (46° 16.176'N 66° 41.583'W)

**The opposite bank of the river is a cliff called the Red Ledges, down which the Buttermilk Falls flows.**
