

## **CEDAR CAMP ICE FALL**

**\*I failed in my attempt to reach this area due to icy road conditions and Cedar Camp Brook being open, but here are my notes/cautionary tale.**

**\*I plan to return in summer to check out the cave.**



**Distance:** about 1.5 km return

**Difficulty:** Challenging.

The Cedar Camp Road needs to be ice free, and the brook must be covered over to make this trip possible.

### **CAUTION:**

**The Cedar Camp Road can be VERY ICEY IN WINTER...The road is not too bad for the first 4 km, but then climbs a steep hill with a VERY steep descent on the other side, and VERY little room to reverse direction at the top of the hill if you have to turn back.**

**You have to cross Cedar Camp Brook on snowshoes, so if the brook is open, then the trip is not possible.**

**There is no defined trail up to the ice fall and cave...although it is visible in the distance.**

**The route up to the ice fall is very steep.**

**The cave area is slippery in winter, and there is always a potential for ice to break away from the cliff.**

**Snowshoes and Icers are needed.**

### **GETTING THERE:**

From the Tim Horton's at 638 Main Street in Sussex, turn left and drive about 3 km on Main Street to the Sussex Corner area.

Bear left at a Y-junction onto the Waterford Road, and drive 9.9 km to Waterford.

In Waterford, turn left onto Cedar Camp Road. **(If it's icy, turn back!)**

Drive about 5.1 km and park near a 4 way intersection.

### **THE TRAIL: (no defined trail)**

From the intersection, walk 100 meters up the road on the right to a camp driveway on the right.

Skirt to the left of the camp driveway, cross the brook at 100 meters and walk on a heading of 176 degrees for about 750 meters up to the ice fall and cave. (45° 41.345N 65° 18.815W)
