

## **DUNBAR FALLS** (North of Fredericton)

**Distance:** about 1 km return

**Difficulty:** Easy, but the trail along the stream has some blowdowns and a couple of rough spots.

**CAUTION:**

**There are a few downed trees that need to be bypassed or climbed over along the trail. About half way along the stream-side trail, there is a brook that has to be crossed by stepping on rocks.**



**Getting There:**

From Fredericton drive out the Killarney Lake Road until it meets Route 148.

Turn left and drive 6.4 km to a side road on the left just before the bridge over Dunbar Stream Park off to the side at the beginning of this gravel road. (46° 8.415'N 66° 37.129'W)

**The Trail:**

From here there are two routes to the falls. (46° 8.683'N 66° 37.455'W)

1. Follow the stream-side trail for 460 meters to the falls.
2. Walk up the road 330 meters, then turn right and walk down a hydro line to intersect the other trail below the falls.

**The trail along the stream is shorter but rougher.**

**The trail along the hydro line may be a bit wet, depending on the recent weather.**

**To make a loop, first walk up the stream to the falls and return via the hydro line.**
