

SEELY BEACH (Fundy Footpath)

Distance: 7 km return

Difficulty: Moderately Challenging. Trail is well marked with white blazes and sporadic flagging tape, but is steep in places.

An extra special wilderness camping spot.

Getting There:

Drive through St. Martins to the Fundy Trail Parkway.

At the gate, let them know that you will be camping overnight at Seely Beach, and then pay the 1 day entrance fee.

Drive to the Interpretive Centre at Big Salmon River.

Go inside and register for the hike to Seely Beach on the Fundy Footpath.

***Remember to check out at the Interpretive Center when you return the next day... they will be looking for you.**

Drive to Long Beach and park in parking area P13.

The Trail:

Walk out the entrance to P13, cross the road and walk past a rock lined ditch to the Fundy Footpath that runs near the edge of the drop off.

Turn left and follow the trail to Seely Beach. (1.5 – 2 hrs)

Shortly before the trail descends to Seely Beach, you will pass the Dragon's Tooth rock on your right.

The Campsites:

There are 2 multi tent campsites in under the trees. The first is just across Seely Brook, and the second is a bit farther down the beach.

There is also room to camp on the beach in front of the second campsite, wind and weather permitting.

Water source:

Walk up Seely Brook one hundred meters to where it tumbles between rocks and filter your water there.
